Why this course?

The SACC PII provides the student with the key skills required to function in a Customs Brokerage. First presented in 1997, this course provides the highly sought after SDS2® required by F&C industry employers.

Upon completion of this course, learners can:

- Classify commodities using the rules for the interpretation of the Harmonised Commodity Coding and Description System (Tariff)
- Interpret INCOTERMS® 2010 as they relate to the calculation of Customs Value
- Calculate customs value for singular and multi-line declarations by applying factorisation formulae
- Produce comprehensive worksheets for Customs declarations (SAD 500)
- Frame singular and multi-line clearance declarations inclusive of ex-bond, rebate declarations and vouchers of correction
- Apply the principles and procedures pertaining to prohibited and restricted imports.

Entrance Requirements:

Graduates of the SDS 1®: SA Customs Compliance Part I or International Forwarding Part 1 or South African Export Compliance courses qualify for entrance onto this course.

Duration:

Part Time: 13 weeks, alternate Saturdays, 08h00 to 13h00 **Investment:** R9 900 (Excl. VAT)

Correspondence: 8 months with two assignments and two workshops. 1st Semester March and 2nd Semester October. **Investment:** R8 900 (Excl. VAT).

In-House: As arranged with the client; minimum of 8 students required.

SDS Certification: Students who successfully complete the SDS final examinations will receive the industry respected SDS 2® Certificate of Competence.

Unit Standard and Assessment Information (Not included in course price):

Students who wish to continue with the assessment/moderation process for the issuance of NQF credits through the Transport Education and Training Authority, have the option to indicate this on the enrolment form. Such students will be contacted by our assessors who will take the assessment and moderation process forward. The skills acquired on this course (after assessment and moderation is completed) contribute 33 credits towards the National Certificate in Freight Forwarding & Customs Compliance (NQF 3) and therefore also contributes towards the achievement of the FIATA Diploma.
